BACKGROUND

Later Life Ambitions (LLA) is determined to ensure that the voice of British pensioners is heard in local government. We're asking that you get in touch with your local councillor or council candidate to ask them to consider the needs of those in later life.

Some areas are having local elections this May. If your local area is not having an election, you can still get in touch with your local Councillor to ask them to support the ambitions of those in later life.

We are asking that you ask your current or potential councillor three simple questions:

WILL YOU ENSURE THAT COUNCIL SERVICES, INCLUDING SUPPORT, ARE ACCESSIBLE TO PEOPLE BOTH ON AND OFFLINE, SO THAT OLDER PEOPLE AND THOSE LESS COMFORTABLE USING TECHNOLOGY ARE NOT EXCLUDED?

WILL YOU ENSURE THAT COUNCIL SERVICES AND POLICIES ARE SET UP IN A WAY THAT CONSIDERS THE NEEDS OF THOSE IN LATER LIFE?

Later Life Ambitions wants all candidates to help change the terms of the debate to focus on the ambitions of pensioners rather than the perceived 'costs' to the rest of society. We therefore encourage our members to personally contact your local candidates and ask them to commit to giving older people the best chance to live fulfilling later lives.

This toolkit has been created by Later Life Ambitions to support members to engage with local candidates in the election, including guidance on how to find out who your local candidates are, how to contact them and what to say. It has been designed to be as simple as possible because it is important for everyone to have their voice heard, regardless of experience or ability.

It is important to write and engage with all candidates in your ward, even if you feel that a particular candidate is likely to be more supportive.

Your council's phone number will be accessible in your local phonebook or on any letters you have received from the council. They will be able to provide you with a postal address to write to.

IV. SEEK A MEETING TO TALK TO CANDIDATES AND COUNCILLORS ABOUT ENSURING OLDER PEOPLE HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO LIVE AMBITIOUS LATER LIVES.

In addition to writing to your candidates and councillors, Later Life Ambitions is encouraging members to seek face-to-face meetings with them as it is more likely to have an impact.

If you secure a meeting, the most important thing is to speak about your personal story and how LLA's asks will ensure yourself and other older people can have fulfilling, aspirational later lives.

You should also tell them what they can do to help. It is important to come to the meeting with 'actions' in mind, for example:

- Print off a copy of Later Life Ambitions' policy positions (available on our website) and take it with you to the meeting.
- Get a picture with them, if you are on social media, you can then share this to your page. Remember to tag **@LaterLives** so that we can see the work you are doing for the campaign.
- Ask them to champion the rights of local older people to ensure they can live fulfilling later lives within their local area.

Follow up after the meeting by writing a short email or letter. Thank the person you met for their time and thoughts, and for their support, if appropriate.

V. SEND A PRESS RELEASE TO YOUR LOCAL NEWSPAPER, RADIO STATION OR NEWSLETTER

Your local BBC radio station or regular local newspaper will be grateful for you providing them with a wellwritten press release and thoughts on your own personal circumstances. They might run it completely unedited, and you might also be asked for a comment or to appear on the air. The Later Life Ambitions team can help you to prepare if you are asked to appear.

Older residents in *insert your area* fight for services for all in local elections

With the local elections on the horizon, a group of older people in **your area** have written to their local **council candidate/councillors** to ask them to keep council services accessible to older people offline and to consider the needs of the ageing population when making policy.

With 2 in 5 people in later life not confident using the internet, the fast pace of change can leave some people feeling left behind. It's incredibly important that vital local services remain accessible to all, no matter how they choose to access them. This includes council services. As some of the most engaged and regular voters, older people are particularly aware of these challenges and are ready to support those who hear their concerns.

Members of national campaigning organisation, Later Life Ambitions have been writing to council candidates in *your area* to make sure that the services people use in their day to day lives, from bins to buses and parking to planning remain open to all. This is particularly important now considering the cost-of-living crisis and the disproportionate impact this has on older people, many of whom are on fixed incomes. As we face an ageing population, making sure services consider older people is even more important.
