# COMMUNICATION - WELFARE - SOCIAL

#### **Branch Priorities**

People occasionally ask, 'What does NARPO do for its members?' Your branch committee has recently addressed that question and the three words at the top of this article set out our agreed priorities.

At the centre of all we do is the welfare of our members and their immediate families.

Supporting the NARPO themes of *Life, work and leisure after the police,* the branch committee leads *Communication, Welfare and Social* programmes.

Whilst we have a full committee, we aim to:

Communication – provide regular branch updates including news & offers, an up-to-date website and newsletters by post to those without email.

Welfare – have committee members dedicated to welfare who can help with tailored responses according to need. We donate to charities relevant to the welfare of our members and have close links with the Essex Police Force Benevolent Fund.

Social - actively support events led by others and maintain a regular social programme meeting the wide range of interests of a diverse membership.

### Vacancy – Volunteer Welfare Representative – Chelmsford Branch

After several years in post, our colleague Tim Stokes will be retiring from this role at the end of March 2023, a vacancy will therefore exist for a new person to join our team. The role is rewarding, and the successful applicant will deal with about fifty referrals a year. The workload is around 6 hours a week but this does vary from time to time.

The role delivers welfare options to members, members loved ones and families. On occasions the representative will assist non-members who have nowhere else to go for support.



The main functions of the role are to deliver welfare options by:

- 1. Direct intervention: This includes welfare visits to ascertain appropriate responses. The work includes assisting members in completion of paperwork, directing to legal advice, negotiating with local authorities, taking the lead on bereavement advice and ensuring appropriate benefits are claimed.
- 2. Signposting help: The representative may also direct members towards help such as the Benevolent Fund and Flint House.

# Other areas of responsibility will include:

- 3. Being a member of the Branch Committee, updating the Committee on welfare matters and producing a written report for the Branch AGM.
- 4. Manage and have responsibility for the welfare budget and negotiate with the Committee for funds which fall outside that budget.
- 5. Liaise with other branches nationally so that members who do not live in Essex receive help.
- 6. Work closely with the Essex Police Benevolent Fund, Police Care UK and other organisations to source additional funds where necessary.
- 7. Take the lead with national issues such as widow's/widower' s pensions for life, injury on duty pension reviews etc.

Training is available via the courses organised by NARPO head office and there is an annual meeting of Regional Welfare Representatives, usually held at Leatherhead, where issues of mutual interest are discussed.

The role is open to any member, or spouse of a member of the Chelmsford Branch. An honorarium is available and reasonable out of pocket expenses will be paid.

Tim will also offer a hand over period to the new representative.

#### **NARPO Annual Conference**

As members may know the 2022 conference coincided with the tragic death of HM Queen Elizabeth II. By the time the Queen's passing became public knowledge delegates from throughout the country were already assembled in Torquay and were in attendance at the



pre-conference dinner. As you would expect, we took appropriate action during the dinner to show our respect and formally acknowledge her death.

Unfortunately, without consulting the delegates present, the NEC decided to cancel the conference scheduled for the following day. Whilst we all understood the significance of the situation, no account was taken of the important items listed on the conference agenda – which have effectively been abandoned or delayed for a further 12 months. Along with some other branches we have also raised the issue of travelling and accommodation costs involved which have to be paid for from local funds. To date the NEC has rejected our claim for reimbursement and I have written to them again expressing our disappointment at the decision.

# Widows and Widowers Pension for Life

The appeal hearing against the order of Mr Justice Fordham, dated 27 May 2022, was held 30 November 2022 at the Royal Courts of Justice. The case is about the human rights compatibility of a mechanism under which a police pension is 'switched off' – that is termination of a widow's or civil partner's pension on remarriage or another event. At the time of writing, we await the outcome.

## **Care Quality Commission - Tell Us About Your Care**

Disabled people, those living with a long-term health condition and their families now have the opportunity to help shape the future of services in England by sharing their experiences of the NHS and the care system with the regulator for the NHS in England – The Care Quality



Commission (CQC). We've received outstanding responses to previous requests for feedback to the CQC and would like to take the opportunity to give those unable to respond at the time the chance to share their experiences of the NHS and care services.

The CQC are asking that you share with them, in confidence, your experiences through their <u>Tell Us About Your Care</u> programme. It allows you to provide the CQC first-hand with your experiences – during hospital stays, GP and dental visits, accessing care services, etc. You can also do so anonymously. The simple to complete <u>questionnaire</u> will ask you for details of the establishment and to describe your experiences as a user of their services. The Tell Us About Your Care page can be located <u>via this link</u>. Once you have completed the questionnaire, we ask that you share this email with your family and friends so that they too can offer their own experience.

If you are unable to complete the survey online, please call us Monday – Friday on 0330 995 0400 and choose Option 1 (afternoons are quietest) and we can complete the survey for you and send your response to the CQC on your behalf.
