The Elizabeth Emblem

On 9 March 2024, the Government announced the introduction of a commemorative emblem as a mark of recognition for those who lost their lives in the course of undertaking eligible public service. This includes police officers who are on the roll of honour.

The design incorporates a rosemary wreath, a traditional symbol of remembrance, surrounding the Tudor Crown. It will be inscribed 'For A Life Given In Service' and will have the name of the person to be commemorated inscribed on the reverse of the emblem.

The Emblem will include a pin to allow the award to be worn by the next of kin of the deceased. The grant of The Elizabeth Emblem will be accompanied by a miniature, and may be worn by the recipient at that person's discretion.

If you are the closest surviving next of kin and would like to apply for the emblem, please do so via the **<u>Cabinet Office website</u>**.

Once your case has been assessed and approved, you have a choice of how the emblem is presented, including via a presentation at a National Police Memorial celebration, should you so wish.

Police Roll of Honour

Incorporated by Royal Charter, the Police Remembrance Trust maintains a record of police officers who lost their lives 'on and in the line of duty', since the earliest of times throughout the UK and Ireland up until 1922.

There are over 5,000 deaths listed in the 'Roll of Honour', and in 2015 the Trust published a book listing all of those who died, entitled the 'UK Police Roll of Remembrance'.

Providing the only authoritative archive of the subject, records will continue to be maintained by the Police Remembrance Trust to commemorate sacrifice in public service.
