2024 Subscriptions

The annual reporting of the CPI, published for September 2023 is 6.7%. This should mean an annual percentage increase for Police Pensions in April 2024 will be the same (previously 10.1%).

However, this is yet to be confirmed by the Government.

Rule 11.3 states that Subject to Rule 11.4, the level of the Minimum Subscription shall be increased annually by the same percentage as the percentage increase in police pensions as determined in the previous year, and where the Minimum Subscription as so increased is not divisible by 12 without involving fractions of a penny, the amount shall be rounded up to the nearest figure which is so divisible. This figure shall be implemented on 1st January of each year.

Therefore, as from 1st January 2024 the minimum subscription will be £26.28 (previously £24.60), this amounts to £2.19 per month (previously £2.05)

CHIEF CONSTABLE'S CHRISTMAS MESSAGE



As this year comes to a close I am delighted to wish all NARPO members a very happy Christmas.

We have managed several high-profile incidents in the last year which has again put Merseyside on the national stage. We had a number of firearm enabled murders last summer including Sam Rimmer, Ashley Dale and Olivia Pratt-Korbel. This was followed by the murders of Jacqui Rutter in October and Elle Edwards, the anniversary which falls on Christmas Eve. The force has worked hard to bring the offenders to justice for the families and our communities. Thomas Cashman was sentenced to 42 years in prison for the murder of Olivia, Connor Chapman 48 years for the murder of Elle, and the four killers of Ashley were sentenced to a combined total of 173 years in prison. Good progress has also been made in the other investigations.

We have showcased the very of best of our officers and staff in the planning for and policing of the Labour Party Conference, Aintree Race Festival and the Open Golf, which had additional challenges this year around protest. Of course, we successfully delivered Eurovision on behalf of Ukraine which is the biggest operation the force has ever had to resource – with the eyes of the world on Liverpool. Eurovision attracts a TV audience of 161 million people, with the World Cup Final being the only single event which is watched by more. It really was a fantastic event to host.

The way in which our force dealt with these tragic incidents and global events has attracted praise from our communities and beyond.

This year we have continued to recruit more officers and staff which has resulted in our headcount being at its highest for 13 years. We are proud to have re-opened St Anne Street Station after significant refurbishment which provides our teams with a state of the art building to equip them to do their roles effectively.

I would like to thank all members for their support and wish you and your families health and happiness in the coming year.
