I recently had cause to research travel insurance. If you are aged between 50 and 74 and particularly if you are approaching your 74th birthday, then please read on. NARPO nationally, has spent significant time and effort in finding a suitable replacement policy as the previous supplier was no longer providing travel insurance. I know this caused many of our members a significant problem, and like me, had to shop round to find a suitable policy, probably at significant cost in many cases. I looked at the most recent NARPO Travel Insurance; it is administered by the Civil Service Insurance Society (CSIS). It is a fixed price annual worldwide policy for either individuals or couples and renews on 1st June every year irrespective of what date you take out the policy. Once you are 'In the system' there is no upper age limit providing you are medically fit to travel. There is no long-winded medical questionnaire to complete, but clearly there are some exclusions, and you need to check if this is a suitable policy for you individually. I personally completed the whole application in 5 minutes, and it was such a relief to know that providing we are medically fit to travel I will not have to worry in the future.
