A Message from our Chair

Firstly I would like to apologise for my absence at the AGM. Unfortunately I was attending the funeral of a friend.

I feel that it is only right that we explain why we have asked for an Extraordinary General Meeting so soon after the AGM.

Over the past year, we have tried to accommodate our members by laying on several functions, which sadly did not receive the support required. I also noticed that the attendance at the free buffets was also falling. Added to this was the poor attendance at the AGM, and the failure to find anyone who was prepared to assist by volunteering for a place on the Committee.

I then made a decision to stand down. Unfortunately this resulted a difference of views within present Committee in that some felt that the Branch should close and others were in favour of it carrying on. For this reason, a Committee Meeting was held on the 15th of April, the main points covered are as follows:-

- The necessity of support from the members, the need for new members to show willingness to serve on the Committee.
- 2. The need to find a replacement for the Secretary's Role as John has made his views very clear in that he has wanted to stand down for some time now. However, it was put forward that no one would volunteer whilst John remained in situ, and therefore a definite date should be agreed when John would stand down.
- 3. What options were available to the Branch?
- The Branch closes down
- The Branch continues and holds functions etc (as last year)
- The Branch reverts to holding minimal functions (i.e. two buffets and dinner) a year.
- It was then decided that an emergency general meeting be held to allow all members to have their say.

Following the Committee Meeting on the 15th, several emails discussing how we progressed were exchanged, resulting in John deciding that he would stand down at the EGM.

On this note I know that I, the Committee and the whole Branch would like to express our thanks to John and Gill for the time effort and devotion they put into resurrecting this Branch and building it up to where it now is.
