Federation Insurance

Those of you who took out life insurance with the Federation and continued that cover after retirement, will know the provider was changed from George Burrows to Phillip Williams recently. There has been some confusion as to whether retired officers are still covered. The cancellation part only relates to those individuals who took out ADDITIONAL LIFE COVER through George Burrows. It doesn't affect the life insurance cover already provided through the Sussex Police Federation and the new providers Phillip Williams. That still remains in place.

To clarify, you only need to concern yourself if you had ADDITIONAL COVER THROUGH George Burrows, the previous insurers. If you had this, you would have been paying it through your bank account direct to George Burrows and not via your pension.

A Year in the Life of a Shepherd

Well, Spring has arrived and we are in the middle of lambing!

Ten years ago, we invested in some land and a flock of sheep to keep us active in our retirement! We have certainly been kept busy—looking after the land, maintaining the fencing, managing the sheep, and building a barn for both storage and providing a safe environment for lambing. We have also planted a number of fruit trees and installed various feeders to encourage a range of wild birds to the area.

In all we have approximately 60 sheep. This year we have 18 ewes in lamb, which after scanning, showed that we were to expect 12 sets of twins and 6 single lambs, totalling 30. At the time of writing we have 23 healthy lambs and are awaiting the arrival of the other 7. This is a family enterprise and our daughter, son-in-law and grandchildren all play a major part in caring for the flock. It is magical to witness the lambs being born and subsequently frolicking together in the field.

Our next date in the calendar is around May/June when shearing takes place. We have 2 mobile shearers who visit and make short work of the task, taking around an hour from start to finish!

Then in Summer, depending on the weather, we cut and bale our own hay before stacking it in the barn. This is usually hot work!

Usually around November 5th (Firework Night) we put the rams in with the ewes and sparks fly! This means that the lambs will be born at the beginning of April the following year and so the cycle begins again.

Keeping sheep has been a steep learning curve, although our son-in-law has previous experience, so we are learning from him and are not on our own. We thoroughly enjoy it and spend many happy hours at the field. There is always something to do and it really makes us appreciate nature in all its glory!
